Eddie moved to Arkadelphia as a small child attending school until he was inducted into the US Army December 6, 1967, during the Vietnam War; being honorably discharged, December 5, 1969. He was employed by and retired from Reynolds Metals Company in Malvern, AR and Troutdale, OR for 33 years combined. He enjoyed truck driving and wanted to keep all of his money for himself, so he purchased his own rig to travel throughout country. Eddie loved his children as well as his extended family dearly. Holding the tradition started by his father he visited many family members every year during the July 4th season.
